The Gabriola Island Community Hall has played a pivotal role in island life for over a century. It has promoted and developed community spirit and citizen involvement while encouraging and facilitating the social, cultural, charitiable and sporting endeavours of Gabriolan organizations and individuals.

As the largest facility of its kind on Gabriola, it serves as a reference point for activities and gatherings of all kinds: weddings; funerals; public meetings to discuss and be informed on issues of community relevance; meetings where politicians and other institutional leaders come to hear the views of the community and to request support / votes; social support programmes; dances; concerts; theatre performances; sports activities of every type; the Gabriola Pre-School.

We have organized and offered free of charge to other Gabriolan non-profits a workshop on fundraising in the digital age.

2. Provide information regarding your organization's revenue generating activities and other sources of income.

The main sources of revenue are rental income (bearing in mind that GICHA has a policy of maintaining low rental rates with the aim of making the Hall as accessible as possible to a wide range of groups); fundraising activities (notably the Salmon BBQ which has been held for the past 64 years and is one of the island's iconic annual events); donations; and grants.

tl k h re T	f successful, this grant will be used as part of a longterm plan for the maintenance and upkeep of the Hall and specifically for the purchase of a new dishwasher. Currently, the equipment in the Hall citchen consists of a sanitizer which is approaching the end of its useful life. Moreover, the sterilizer has somewhat complicated instructions which, despite the Hall managment's best efforts, often results in misuse by various groups utilizing the kitchen which in turn necessitates costly repairs. The proposed new machine, a Stero SUH high temperature undercounter dishwasher and sanitizer, is a top of the line commercial machine which conforms to VIHA standards and which is very simple to operate.

6.	Describe the benefit of the project for the residents fo the Regional District.
	A reliable commercial dishwasher will greatly improve the functionality of the kitchen and consequently the many groups and organizations who use the kitchen will derive a direct benefit. The Hall itself will also benefit from not having to arrange for emergency callouts to deal with the blocked sanitizer.

7. How many people does your organization anticipate will attend, benefit or participate in this project?

Over the course of a year, more than 3,000 people visit the Hall for various events and programmes. We estimate that 75% of those will utilize the kitchen for tea / coffee / meal / snack preparation. All groups are expected to clean up the kitchen after use, as per the standard rental contract, so all will benefit from the upgraded equipment.

8. Describe how the project will promote volunteer participation and citizen involvement. Include a description of the types of roles the volunteers will undertake.

More groups will be ebcouraged to use the Hall with a functional dishwasher, knowing that clean-up after activities is now simpler, quicker and practically foolproof.

Grant funding will be used to provide 50% of the costs associated with the replacement of the dishwasher. Expenses are aas follows :
