When we saw that the old run-dow n farm on Northwest Bay Road had been sold, we hoped that it would remain agricult ural and would not be developed as a subdivision of homes. I was born and raised on a working ranch, and I could see the potential that had been lost through neglect. We certainly appreciate that new homes ARE needed for a burgeoning population, but thi s small farm was something we passed by often and we hoped it could be "saved" as it was. The BEST news was that the owners were young, ambitious and DID plan to s ave it and to offer it to the public by creating a small eatery with home-grown produce where we could meet with neighbours and friends and share simple, healthy meals. We watched as improvements to the land were slowly made. By then we had learned the owners' names. 






Hello Mr. Keller

I am note sure if my previous note to you went through, so I am resending this to make sure our concerns about this application are documented.

My wife and I own the property at 3144 Northwest Bay Rd., immediately adjacent to the subject property of Development Application No. PL2019-225. We have lived at this address since 2004.

I will start by saying that we are not opposed to the operation of the cafe and brewery. But there are several aspects to the current development application that we do not support and feel will be disruptive and negatively affect the well being of neighbouring property owners. We'd like to see the development kept to a small scale (just the brewery and eatery, with parking immediately adjacent) and not include any development of the adjoining fields for special events or any other purpose than agricultural.

Concern #1: We do not support any form of "Special Events Endorsement" for the fields surrounding the proposed brewery building and cafe. A large part of the area highlighted in yellow on the site plan lies immediately behind our property and those of our neighbours on Northwest Bay Road. We have talked to most of the neighbours on our stretch of Northwest Bay Road that border the subject property and they share our concern with having a road, parking, possibly special events, a commercial septic field and manure composting area directly behind us on what is supposed to be agricultural land. The application is vague as to what kind of "special events" are being considered, but any sort of outdoor concerts, RV camping etc. would be very disruptive to the neighbourhood and don't seem to be consistent with agricultural land. A large part of what is shown as special events area is also currently designated as wetland (see the image from the provincial freshwater atlas, attached as a Word document). The area used to also have an ephemeral creek that ran through it (see the attached Google Earth image). Not sure if it fed or drained the wetland but it's no longer above ground as the area has been filled and graded. It does still get very wet and muddy at wet times of the year. Ever since the changing of the surface drainage in the wetland area behind us, both the quality and quantity of the water in our neighbours domestic shallow well (3138 Northwest Bay) has diminished.

Concern #2: Overflow parking that is right behind our properties and approximately 200 metres away from the proposed pub/eatery. The place is proposed to be open until 11:00 PM, 7 nights a week. It would make more sense to keep all of the parking up right at the pub/café building where there are no neighbours to bother with vehicle noise late at night and also avoid having patrons (after having a few pints) having to hike 200 metres behind all of our homes at 11:00 closing time to get to their vehicles, then drive past all our backyards to get out of the subject property to leave.

Concern # 3. In the time that I have lived here, I have seen the location of the proposed septic field on the site plan completely submerged by flood water from Nanoose Creek several times. In fact I have seen the water deep enough that there were spawning salmon swimming across the fields at about the location on the map occupied by the label "Plan 3074". Hence the wetland designation for the area (see Concern #1, above). The flooding is not the only reason that this is unlikely to be a suitable location for a septic field. The neighbouring properties closest to the proposed septic field are both on relatively shallow domestic wells (about a 60 feet drilled well and a 25 feet dug well) that are located nearer the back of their properties (closer to the proposed septic field). All of us that live in the Northwest Bay Road neighbourhood adjacent to the subject property are worried about the effect that a septic field intended to support up to 150 patrons will have on our ground water as we are all on relatively shallow wells. If our drinking water is affected by the proposed septic field, we would expect the Regional District to extend municipal water service to our neighbourhood to remedy the situation. A smaller maximum capacity for the pub and relocation of the proposed septic field from behind the only residential neighbouring properties might avoid this problem.

Concern #4: This concern relates more to the agricultural development that has been done and proposed plans. The property owners have 17 acres on which to put their greenhouse (existing) and manure composting area and they have chosen to put both right up as dose as they possibly can to the only residential neighbours that they have. The layout of the two is such that the exhaust fan from the greenhouse helps to disperse the smell from the manure composting over to their neighbours. They have excavated the bank on their side of the property (which is between 10 and 30 feet lower than the adjacent residential properties) and placed concrete lock blocks to stabilize the bank and allow their manure composting, greenhouse and an equipment shed to be built as close to the property lines as possible. I realize that this has nothing to do with the proposed application for a brewery but I think it does show the level of consideration that neighbouring properties have been given in previous activities.

Our next door neighbour at 3138 Northwest Bay Road has asked that I sign his name to this note as well, as he shares all of the same concerns but does not have internet service or email.
