

**Delegation:** Eamon Stinson, re Ravensong Aquatic and Parks and Recreation Policy

**Summary:** Given: the citizenry within the RDN has been ordered to follow discriminatory protocols that restrict the movement and participation of some members of its community via the "BC Vaccine Passport" requirement. And given: some private businesses open to the public within the RDN are ordered by the BC PHO to restrict the participation of community members who are inoculation-free from their services, we sincerely object to and are repulsed by the actions of the RDN to create two-tiers of citizens within the Region - specifically when both tiers are equal tax-payers while only one tier is able to access the product of those compulsory taxes - i.e. PARKS AND RECREATION / RAVENSONG POOL.

The coercive nature of this inoculation protocol is discrimination against those who understand their body and health in a way other than what self-decreed "health authorities" postulate.

Restrictions of some citizens from participating in private business functions is understandable to the degree that these private business services are essentially luxury "non-essential" services and the common citizen cannot demand it be included in the "essential" makeup of our society - as it is currently believed to be not.

Taxpayer funded community services are HOWEVER essential in so far as they are the product of the capital energy derived from said community in the form of compulsory tax withholding that is directly requested by the RDN for their services to the community.

No representation?

Fine.

No taxation.

We pay for tax-based infrastructures as citizens of this Region. If we are denied entry or usage of said services, we demand remuneration immediately. Thank you.

**Action Requested:** Either:

Remove the policy of proving "Vaccination Status" to participate in taxpayer funded services within the Region - specifically remove this requirement for Ravensong Pool in Qualicum Beach.

Or

Continue to enforce the BC PHO by refusing services to the inoculation-free BUT credit back all portions of citizen tax amounts used to fund Ravensong Pool and other Parks and Recreation programs to those citizens who have been denied services for refusing to participate in the discriminatory "Vaccine Passport" system.
