



Dear Greg, Rob and Pat

Thank you for meeting with us on July 7.

We would like to move forward with discussions on the mutual benefits of using the home on the proposed expansion site for the Wastewater Management Plant.

As discussed, we are aware that the house would be used as the construction offices during the next phase of expansion of the Plant. Our proposal involves the subsequent use of the dwelling to meet the needs of the community while addressing the needs of the Plant.

For future purposes, the dwelling could provide accommodation for office space and an education and interpretive centre tying into the newly established Nature Park in the French Creek Estuary. The space could be utilized for educational purposes and the development of programs that would involve both youth and the general public.

Organizations such as the Friends of French Creek Conservation Society, Mid Vancouver Island Habitat Enhancement Society, Qualicum Beach Stream Keepers, First Nations, RDN Drinking Water Watershed Protection Program and RDN Parks could utilize the space for educational purposes, estuary and freshwater management along with an awareness of the importance of natural resources.

Seniors in our community have already indicated to us they would be willing to provide their skills and talents in the rehabilitation of the dwelling, as well as the ongoing operation and maintenance of the building and grounds.

Youth in the community that do not have access to a place suitable for studying are currently seeking a central location that would provide a safe and quiet place to meet, socialize and study. They have formed a non-profit society (Youth4Youth) that is volunteer driven by grade 11 and 12 students from Ballenas and Kwalicum Senior Secondary Schools. The students are willing, as volunteers, to assist in the ongoing maintenance of the landscape and have a mentor working with them in that field.

The RDN Wastewater Management staff would have an on-site location for education, displays and the ability to offer tours of the facility along with information regarding the current and future growth of the plant.

There are many grant opportunities in the community, as well as provincial and federal grants to defray the costs of running and maintaining the building.

We see this as a useful, centrally located facility in the RDN community and we would appreciate the opportunity to put before the RDN Board of Directors a proposal with complete information and endorsements from the community.

Again, thank you for meeting with us. We look forward to further discussions.
